

Alaska's unemployment rate fell five-tenths of a percentage point in July to 6.9 percent, according to Dan Robinson, a labor economist with the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development. The decline represents a typical seasonal movement in an economy that nearly always reaches peak employment in July or August. The comparable national rate fell two-tenths of a percentage point to 6.3 percent.

Five of the state's six economic regions saw lower rates in July. The Northern Region, which consists of the Nome Census Area and the North Slope and Northwest Arctic Boroughs, recorded an increase from 17.7 percent to 17.9 percent. Both the Gulf Coast Region and the Southwest Region saw significantly lower rates in July due mostly to summer fishing.

Anchorage's rate fell from 5.4 percent to 5.2 percent. Juneau saw a similar decline, from 5.8 percent to 5.5 percent. Fairbanks' drop was more dramatic, from 6.5 percent down to 5.8 percent in July.

Anchorage and Fairbanks recorded lower rates due to slight declines in total employment, but bigger percentage declines in unemployment. Juneau's rate, on the other hand, fell based on a significant increase in employment and an almost unchanged number of unemployed persons.

July estimates of wage and salary employment show an increase of 8,200 jobs since June. Most of the jobs added in July were in seafood processing, although the visitor industries also continued to make seasonal hires.

Alaska has added approximately 2,300 jobs over the year. The growth has come from a variety of industries, though nearly half of the new jobs are in the category of health care and social assistance. Some of the growth in those industries is due to the privatization of institutions that were formerly counted as part of government employment. Employment in the oil and gas industry is down more than 1,000 jobs over the year and seafood processing employment is down by more than 500.

These individuals are considered not in the labor force.
