

Alaska's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged in June at 5.9 percent, according to the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development. The comparable national rate was also unchanged at 4.5 percent.

Alaska's unemployment rates tend to be between one and two percentage points higher than the nation's, but not necessarily because the state's economy is consistently less healthy. Alaska's very seasonal employment patterns create more short-term unemployment as job seekers and employers match themselves up every year for seasonal work.

The Denali Borough had the state's lowest unemployment rate in June at 2.3 percent (rates for boroughs and census areas are not seasonally adjusted). The Wade Hampton Census Area had the highest at 22.8 percent.

Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau all registered unemployment rates for June that were about half a percentage point lower than in June 2006.

Among the state's six economic regions, Southeast had the lowest aggregate unemployment rate, although the region has seen little employment growth. The lower rates are being caused instead by a decline in unemployment that is likely due to a combination of economic factors including the migration of workers and the aging of the work force.

Payroll employment rose by 15,400 in June, led by seasonal hires in construction, seafood processing and tourism-related businesses. Over-the-year comparisons show growth of 2,500 jobs, a little lower than in recent months.

The oil and gas industry continued to lead the way, adding 800 jobs from June 2006 to June 2007. Seafood processing, construction and government all had over-the-year declines.
